Working to ISO 14001 Standards

ISO 14001 is an internationally agreed standard that sets out the requirements for an environmental management system. It helps organizations improve their environmental performance through more efficient use of resources and reduction of waste, gaining a competitive advantage and the trust of stakeholders.

Utilising an Environmental Management System helps us identify, manage, monitor and control our environmental issues in a "holistic" manner.

Our ISO 14001 management based system requires us to consider all environmental issues relevant to our operations, such as air pollution, water and sewage issues, waste management, soil contamination, climate change mitigation and adaptation, and resource use and efficiency.

Adhering to an ISO 14001 management system ensures continual improvement of our organisation's systems and approach to environmental concerns.

Implementing an Environmental Management System allows us to;

1. Demonstrate compliance with current and future statutory and regulatory requirements
2. Increase leadership involvement and engagement of employees
3. Improve company reputation and the confidence of stakeholders through strategic communication
4. Achieve strategic business aims by incorporating environmental issues into business management
5. Provide a competitive and financial advantage through improved efficiencies and reduced costs
6. Encourage better environmental performance of suppliers by integrating them into the organisation's business systems
